ABOUT THE PROGRAM

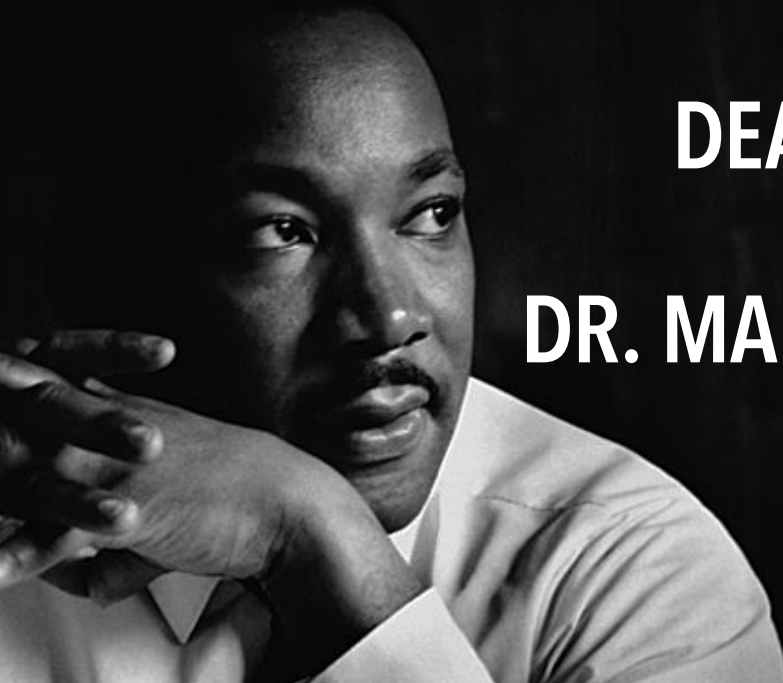
Although this nation was founded on principles of civil rights — the idea that every person is born equal, regardless of religion, race, gender, sexual orientation and other identifying markers — civil rights cases are filed across the nation each year. When civil rights are violated, attorneys need to consider not only current legislation, but also constitutional amendments and their application to the law.

Dr. King and other civil rights activists made a lasting impact utilizing nonviolent protests and a consistent message. The push for civil rights is still paramount. The strides made by Dr. King and other civil rights activists lead us to the place we are today, but, we still have a ways to go. Dr. King was assassinated on April 4, 1968 in Memphis at the age of 39. The year 2018 marks 50 years after his death.

For almost 20 years, the Rev. John Moore, Sr. of Magnolia has brought his impersonation of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. to various audiences, complete with the revolutionary's intonations and inflections. The Rev. Moore makes 30 to 40 appearances a year as a King reenactor, taking the message up and down the state. Although Rev. Moore grew up in tough circumstances in Philadelphia, he completed a 20-year career in the U.S. Air Force and is now the Vice President of Resource Development for United Way of Delaware.

Rodney A. Smolla, Esquire is an award-winning author and First Amendment scholar. He is currently the Dean of Widener University Delaware Law School. Dean Smolla will pose questions to "Dr. King" that help the audience understand the Civil Rights points made in Dr. King's speeches and writings.

It was his response to a public statement of concern and caution issued by eight white religious leaders of the South.
