    - i. Bruce initiated a discussion on the lawsuits filed against Apple for slowdowns of pre-iPhone 10 operating systems. A Motion for Transfer of Actions to N.D. Cal. was filed on January 2, 2018.
    - ii. James and Chuck commented on their firmsøphase-out of Blackberries.
    - iii. Joan reported on the start of the blockchain platform for a stock exchange for startups. Delaware Board of Trade (DBOT) has announced the launch of a blockchain platform to connect startups with investors, thereby facilitating capital raising and trading. The platform will provide more liquidity and shorter settlement times than traditional crowdfunding platforms. DBOT is the first alternative trading system licensed by the US Securities and Exchange commission that uses blockchain technology.
